and Jean Jones travelled through the leafy lanes of Cheshire to Macclesfield Flower Club. What a fabulous venue! Large flat car park, a few easy steps plus a ramp open out into a light airy room with plenty of space for our event. Tracy-Anne arrived minutes after us and we were greeted by an army of willing helpers who unloaded our boxes and kept us supplied with tea and coffee. Why were we there? Well, this was the first official outing since the naming of The Flower School of Cheshire to deliver a beginner's workshop. Macclesfield Flower Club hosted,

After a brief illustrated talk on preparing our flowers and the various mechanics available we demonstrated three simple designs that could be followed or interpreted however people wanted to. 

#### Stewarding at the Show - Could you Help?

The Show Team would like your help please. If you are considering volunteering with a friend, please let Maureen know so that you can be scheduled at the same time and then be able to enjoy a look around the showground together afterwards.

Maureen Hernon (Sale) the Steward's Secretary writes:

'Once again, we are asking Flower Clubs to provide members who would like to steward at the Royal Cheshire Show. The stewards are extremely important to us, as it means that we have a friendly face to interact with our visitors, and their help is gratefully acknowledged.

We are offering 4 time slots and would like volunteers to sign up for any 2 of them. The slots are:

Morning: 10.00 am - 11.30 pm. AND 11.30 am - 1.00 pm. Afternoon: 1.00 pm - 2.30 pm. AND 2.30 pm - 4.00 pm.

We also would like volunteers to help with 'children's hands-on' activities as well as stewarding. The task of stewarding entails sitting or standing in an allotted position and being ready to answer the visitors' questions, discussing Flower Clubs with those who show an interest, and directing them to the Publicity table if required and distributing the voting slips for "The People's Choice Award". This has proved to be very popular and provides a good opportunity to engage with the visitors. The success of this award depends on the stewards giving out lots of voting cards and persuading visitors to vote for their favourite designs. It encourages people to look more closely at the exhibits and appreciate the work involved. It is also necessary to discourage members of the public from touching or moving any component of the exhibit, explaining that some plant materials may cause allergies, and pointing out interesting features in the exhibit. A sash or badge will be provided to identify stewards. Tea and coffee making facilities are available to use before and after each shift, but drinks not to be brought to stewarding positions.

Stewards will receive a free entry ticket a few days before the show. (Public admission to the show is £30 in advance or £35 on the day). All parking is free and disabled parking is close to the entrance. Should the volunteer have to cancel for any reason it is important that they let the steward's secretary know as soon as possible.
