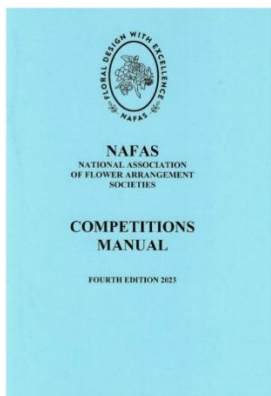

Winner of the first prize cup in 2024 / 2025 was Carole Chia and winner of the Daphne Bridge Rose Bowl cup was Ann Schuberth

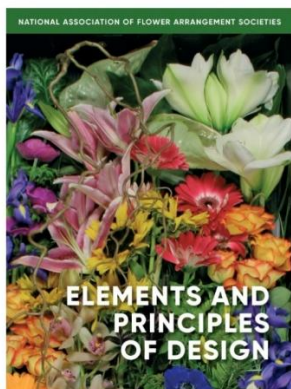
All the entries are created with enthusiasm so that the Competition Table delights members and guests and hopefully appeals to the Judge !!

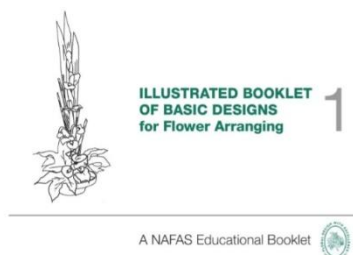

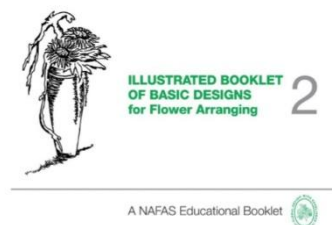

THEME – What a Wonderful World

Class 1 – A NAFAS Areas class.

Earthly Beauty

An exhibit

- Staged on a base 30 cm high, painted sage green.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 240 cm, depth 120 cm, height from floor including the base 240 cm.
- Background 210 cm high will be provided and painted sage green.
- Exhibitors may provide their own drapes/backcloth/base cloth and title.
- To be staged by up to five people.
- To be viewed and judged from the front.
- Limited to 9 exhibits.



Please note – Area names may only be displayed after judging

Class 2

Captivating Landscapes

An exhibit.

- Staged on a round base, diameter 122cm, height 10cm, painted black.
- Space allowed: not to exceed diameter 122cm, height optional.
- To be staged by up to two people.
- Title may be included.
- To be viewed and judged all round.
- Limited to 6 exhibits.

Class 3

Live Life in Full Bloom

A pedestal class

- Staged on the floor against a black background.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 122cm, depth 122cm, height optional.
- Exhibitors may bring their own staging if desired.
- To be viewed and judged from the front.

The use of plastic based floral foam is strictly prohibited

Class 4

A Dream Garden

An exhibit.

- Staged on the floor in front of a white picket fence 92cm high.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 120cm, depth 120cm, height optional.
- To be viewed and judged from the front.

British grown plant material should predominate.

Class 5

A Patchwork of Colour

A pavé

- Staged on the seat of a chair painted blue-grey (provided).
Space allowed: not to exceed seat dimensions width 39cm, depth 40cm, height from floor 45cm.
- May be arranged on site or brought ready assembled at competitor's discretion.
- To be viewed and judged from the front
- Limited to 6 exhibits.



Class 6

What a Wonderful World

A contemporary exhibit

- Staged on cylindrical drum diameter 92cm, height 61cm painted Valspar X110R218E 'Glistening Aqua'.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 76 cm, depth 76 cm, height optional.
- To be viewed and judged from all round.
- Limited to 6 entries.

Class 7

A Timeless Masterpiece

A miniature exhibit

- Staged on a blue-grey painted coaster on tabling 76cm high covered in forest green fabric.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 10cm, depth 10cm and height 15cm.
- May be brought ready assembled.
- To be viewed and judged from the front.
- Limited to 15 exhibits.

NB: an entry in this class only entitles the competitor to one complimentary ticket (Sunday only).

The use of plastic based floral foam is strictly prohibited

Class 8

Jewels of the Sea

A petite exhibit

- Staged on a block width 25.5cm, depth 25.5cm, height 9.5cm, painted blue-grey and displayed on tabling 76cm high covered in forest green fabric.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 25cm and depth 25cm, height optional.
- May be brought ready assembled.
- To be viewed and judged from the front.
- Limited to 15 exhibits.

NB: an entry in this class only entitles the competitor to one complimentary ticket (Sunday only).

Class 9

The Long, Hot Summer

An exhibit

- Staged on a raised square base, width 122cm, depth 122cm, height 25cm, painted black.
- Space allowed: width 122cm, depth 122cm, height optional.
- Competitors may bring their own accessories
- To be viewed and judged all around.
- Limited to 14 exhibits.

Class 10

In a Spin

A craft exhibit

- Designed to be hung from a horizontal rail (provided) approximately 2m from ground level, hook provided.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 60cm, depth 60cm, maximum drop from hook 100cm.
- May be brought ready assembled.
- To be viewed and judged all around.
- Limited to 8 exhibits.

NB: an entry in this class only entitles the competitor to one complimentary ticket (Sunday only).

The use of plastic based floral foam is strictly prohibited

Class 11

It's Coming Home?

An exhibit

- To be staged on an uncovered table, width 75cm, depth 75cm, height 76cm. Competitors may bring their own table covering.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 95cm, depth 95cm, height optional.
- Accessories allowed.
- Sides and corners of the table may be decorated.
- To be viewed and judged all round.

Class 12

The Big Bang

An exhibit

- Staged on a cube, width 61 cm, depth 61 cm, height 56 cm painted in black.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 100cm, depth 100cm, height optional.
- To be viewed all round and judged from the front.
- Limited to 14 exhibits.

Class 13 – Junior Class - Open to ages under 12 (Age to be stated on entry form)

Winnie the Pooh is 100!

A craft exhibit

- Staged on tabling 76cm high and covered in forest green fabric.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 76cm, depth 76cm, height optional.
- Natural plant material must be included.
- May be brought ready assembled.
- To be viewed and judged all round.
- **Not judged under NAFAS rules**

NB: an entry in this class only entitles the competitor to one complimentary ticket plus one ticket for an accompanying adult (Sunday only).

Class 14 - Junior Class - Open to ages under 16 (Age to be stated on entry form)

Winnie the Pooh is 100!

A craft exhibit

- Staged on tabling 76 cm high and covered in forest green fabric.
- Space allowed: not to exceed width 76cm, depth 76cm, height optional.
- Natural plant material to predominate.
- May be brought ready assembled.
- To be viewed and judged from the front.
- **Judged under NAFAS rules**

NB: an entry in this class only entitles the competitor to one complimentary ticket plus one ticket for an accompanying adult (Sunday only).
