## NAFAS Renewal Programme - Update

Through this four-part integrated Renewal Programme, we will position NAFAS to grow its presence and positive impact in society, including growth in membership.

Renewal that will enable us to be flexible and nimble in responding to the challenges and opportunities ahead, both now and in the future.

### The Renewal Programme - What You Need To Know

26 MARCH 2026 - UNANIMOUSLY AGREED

On 26 March 2026, the NAFAS Board and the 20 Area Chairmen making up the National Advisory Council unanimously agreed a new three-year Renewal Programme. The Board allocated significant investments to make this possible.

The agreed Renewal Programme is designed to increase membership and ensure we reflect the needs and aspirations of our current and potential new members. It is comprised of four interdependent parts, informed by robust market research; namely:

#### Governance

Working with Clubs and Areas, a renewal of governance at a National, Area and club level, ensuring structures are sustainable and better-support ongoing activities.



#### Database

Creation of a GDPR compliant national database, administered by NAFAS Head Office, enabling stronger communication between individual members, clubs, Areas and the national organisation.



#### Website

Creation of a new website to better represent us externally and provide password protected access to member benefits.



#### Brand and Logo

Development of a new brand that both respects the history of NAFAS and is outward facing, to raise public awareness and generate new membership.



**What is going to happen?** The Renewal Programme is not a quick fix. NAFAS and its clubs have seen a steady decline in membership since 2000, so this is a staged programme, delivered incrementally over the next three years, starting from May 2026.

**1 Year 1 - 2026 - 27**  
Building the infrastructure – a new website with database integration, a new brand and logo, and a new database.

**2 Year 2 - 2027 - 28**  
Testing, implementation and refinement of the core infrastructure developed in Year 1.

**3 Year 3 - 2028 - 29**  
Full roll out and move to the new ways of working.

**What does this mean for you and your club?** We have listened closely to clubs and Areas and anticipate a number of helpful benefits of this shift. These include:

#### For Members

- A streamlined national membership fee – replacing multiple affiliation fees for those who belong to more than one club.
- Member discounts for NAFAS events and from our partners.
- Improved communication with your club, Area and NAFAS nationally.
- Access to "member only" benefits and resources within the new website.

#### For Clubs and Areas

- Support with legal compliance - access to up-to-date policies, procedures and event templates.
- Better data management through the national database.
- Better deals through bulk purchasing, such as public liability insurance.
- Increased membership through national marketing campaigns directing new interest to local clubs.
- Streamlined governance structures and reduced administration, allowing more time for activities, friendship and flowers.

**Class 6. The Great Outdoors:** An exhibit. Foliage to predominate

Space allowed: width 80cm, depth 60cm, height optional.

**Class 7. A Royal Wedding:** An exhibit.

Space allowed: width 80cm, depth 60cm, height optional.

*This is a novice class and is only open to exhibitors who have not been placed first at a previous Nantwich Show Floral Art competition.*

*This class is being sponsored by Flower Clubs of Mercia & North Wales, and the exhibitor placed first can claim a year's subscription to one of the clubs affiliated to the group.*

## **IMPORTANT**

1. All sizes are approximate.
2. All exhibits may be staged or brought in ready assembled.
3. All exhibits are to be staged on tabling approximately 75cm high.
4. The staging cloths are of a mushroom colour.
5. Exhibits will be viewed and judged from the front.
6. Nothing is to be attached to the marquee.
7. The use of aerosol sprays inside the marquee is not permitted.
8. Only one entry per class.
9. All exhibits left at owner's risk.

While we do not prohibit the use of floral foam, we ask that you respect and be mindful of the environment and sustainability.

## **RULES**

All exhibits will be judged in accordance with NAFAS 'Competitions Manual' Fourth Edition 2023. The judges' decision will be final.

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule.

Exhibits must be staged at the show venue unless otherwise stated in the show schedule.

Disqualification will take place for the following reasons:-

- Failure to comply with any specific requirement of a class as stated in the show schedule e.g. the measurements or the components.
- Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have the roots or the cut ends of stems in water retaining material.

Exceptions: Air plants, cacti, fruits, fungi, grass turf, lichen, moss, succulents, vegetables and long-lasting plant material WHICH WILL REMAIN TURGID FOR THE DURATION OF THE SHOW. (Definition of turgid – the state of firmness of plant tissue relating from adequate moisture causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

- Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed in the show schedule).

For further details and definitions, please refer to the NAFAS Competitions Manual Fourth Edition 2023, in accordance with which all classes will be judged.

## **STAGING**

Exhibits may be staged or brought in ready assembled between 10.00am and 3.00pm on Tuesday 28th July 2026.

Exhibits may be removed after 5.30pm on show day and must be cleared by 6.30pm.

## JUDGING

Judging will commence at 3.30pm on Tuesday 28th July 2026.

In addition, one class will also be judged as "People's Choice" and voted on by the general public. Voting to close at 3.00pm on show day.

Prizes for all classes: 1st £10, 2nd £7, 3rd £4
